EXHIBIT JUDGING SCORECARD

- ATTRACTS ATTENTION – 20 Points.** Use of color, motion, light figures. While attention-getting is important, the reaction should be favorable. Unfavorable attention defeats its purpose.
- AROUSES INTEREST – 10 Points.** Encourages additional study. Personal appeal to the type of viewer for whom the exhibit was designed.
- CONVEYS MESSAGE – 30 Points.** The message should be understandable to the viewer for whom the exhibit was intended.
- DESIGN – 20 Points.** Elements of the exhibit should be pleasingly placed to give a sense of unity to the whole. The message should be a part of the design and not something apparently added as an afterthought. Simplicity is the key here.
- WORKMANSHIP – 10 Points.** Neat, well-constructed for the purpose. This does not imply that expensive materials be used.
- ORIGINALITY – 10 Points.**

General Rules

1. Violation of any rule shall constitute a disqualification.
2. Contest to be governed by judge or judges with all decisions final.
3. Judges have the right to stop and disqualify any tractor if it is not being operated in such a manner as would be considered safe.
4. Tractors will be weighed at registration. If deemed necessary by the judges, any tractor may be reweighed at any time.
5. Pit Pass Fee - \$12.00 if paid at time of initial registration. Must be present to sign waiver at this time. Driver and helper free.
6. No minors under 16 allowed in pit unless an operator. Proof of age is required.

FARM STOCK TRACTOR RULES

1. No consumption of alcoholic beverages or narcotics in track or pit area. Failure to observe rules will result in removal from track or pit area with no refund of entry fee; also will be barred from pulling with this organization for one full year.
2. **All contestants must be 12 years of age with written parental consent through age 18. All drivers must wear shoes that completely cover the foot (no sandals), shirt, long pants before they are permitted to compete.**
3. Judges have the right to re-weigh or re-tech any tractor anytime during or after the pull.
4. All engine fans must be shrouded with factory shroud or min. of 1/16" thick steel.
5. No weight may extend more than 24" beyond the most forward point of the tractor.
6. The tractor tires must remain in the boundaries of the contest course.
7. Min. draw bar length of 18" from the center of the rear axle to the point of hook.
