WORKMANSHIP - 10 Points. Neat, well-constructed for the purpose. This does not imply that expensive materials be used.

General Rules

1. Violation of any rule shall constitute a disqualification.
2. Contest to be governed by judge or judges with all decisions final.
3. Judges have the right to stop and disqualify any tractor if it is not being operated in such a manner as would be considered safe.
4. Tractors will be weighed at registration. If deemed necessary by the judges, any tractor may be reweighed at any time.
5. Pit Pass Fee - \$12.00 if paid at time of initial registration. Must be present to sign waiver at this time. Driver and helper free.
6. No minors under 16 allowed in pit unless an operator. Proof of age is required.

FARM STOCK TRACTOR RULES

1. No consumption of alcoholic beverages or narcotics in track or pit area. Failure to observe rules will result in removal from track or pit area with no refund of entry fee; also will be barred from pulling with this organization for one full year.
2. **All contestants must be 12 years of age with written parental consent through age 18. All drivers must wear shoes that completely cover the foot (no sandals), shirt, long pants before they are permitted to compete.**
3. Judges have the right to re-weigh or re-tech any tractor anytime during or after the pull.
4. All engine fans must be shrouded with factory shroud or min. of $\frac{1}{16}$ " thick steel.
5. No weight may extend more than 24" beyond the most forward point of the tractor.
6. The tractor tires must remain in the boundaries of the contest course.
7. Min. draw bar length of 18" from the center of the rear axle to the point of hook. Draw bar must be stationary in all directions. Max. height of 20" from top of hitching device parallel to the ground. Clevis to be measured to the center.
8. Draw bar to be equipped with steel hitching device not more than 1.5" thick & a $\frac{3}{2}$ " diameter opening. Cross sectional thickness must be measured $\frac{7}{8}$ " min. to 1.5" max. Pulling point must not be more than 1.5" from back edge of the pulling device.
9. No pressurized tanks unless UL approved. No nitrous oxide, oxygen or propane.
10. No water injection.
11. All tractors must compete using the fuel that was intended by the factory.
12. All tractors competing must run under a working governor.
13. No portion of the tractor may interfere with any portion of the sled or the sled hitching device during the pull. This includes weights.
14. All weights must be secured to the tractor (no tarp straps). No weights permitted on the seat or deck, inc. cab tractors. Any ballast or external parts lost while hooked to the sled will be cause for disqualification of that class, excluding internal parts.
15. All tractors must be equipped with workable rear brakes. Use of torque converters, power shifts, etc. is permitted.
16. Contestant has 100' to the front of the tractor to decide on change of gear, one restart per class. No restart permitted in a pull off.
17. Driver must be in total control of the tractor at all times while pulling and operate in a safe manner or be disqualified at the discretion of the flag person.
18. Tractor must be stopped upon signal from either track official. Pull is considered over when forward motion of the sled stops, no hole digging allowed.
19. All tractors must be in neutral or park transmission selector while being hooked and unhooked.
20. The number one puller will be the test puller, and may take the pull if the working condition of the weight machine is satisfactory. Driver will have the option to take the pull or drop to the sixth pulling position. All decisions on re-pulls must be made before the tractor leaves the track. In the event the weight transfer is changed there is no option to drop.
21. Each contestant may spot the sled for their pull. Contestant must notify track official or sled operator before the sled is backed into start position.
22. **All contestants must pull in position drawn within 3 minutes of sled spotting or will be disqualified. Track officials must be notified of any delays, and then the contestant may become last puller.**
23. All pulls must start with a tight hitch, no jerking.
24. Disqualification for any reason will result in no prize monies for that class.
25. Registration closes at the start of the first class, unless due to traffic conditions. Judges' decision to be final.
26. No bracing above center of the rear axle unless cradled, except complete factory setup.
27. Farm stock classes are, but not limited to: 7500#, 9500#, 11,500# and 13,500#.
28. All classes must have hood grill and fenders.
29. There will be a 3000-rpm limit on all classes. Flagman has authority to stop & check.
30. Tire size limited to 20.8" wide and 42" high max.
31. Contest open to two-wheel-drive farm stock tractors with rubber tires. NO SHARPENED TIRES, no dual tires, no studs or chains permitted. Four-wheel-drive tractors are permitted if front wheels are disengaged.
32. Tractor motor and chassis must conform with one another, including carburetor

and injection system.

33. No tractor may pull more than once in any class.

34. Failure to obey either flag person will result in disqualification of that class.

35. Any fighting will result in removal from grounds without refund of any entry fees and prize monies.

36. Tractors are required to have a working PTO.

37. Add-on turbo is permitted, no bigger than a 3LM housing with a 3" inlet max. and 3" outlet. Other turbos must be factory equipped size & specs. Limit of one turbo.

HOT FARM TRACTOR RULES

1. All tractors must be stock appearing. All hoods, grills, fenders and frame must be stock appearing for make and model being pulled. Tractor must have stock block or its replacement. All tractors must use the fuel the factory engine was designed for.

2. Wide front-ends only.

3. No pressurized fuel tanks allowed. Diesel is the only acceptable fuel.

4. Water for cooling purposes of the turbo will be permitted, no types of accelerants or oxygen extenders or the like will be permitted.

5. Tractors must be equipped with steel hitching device not more than 1.5" thick & with a 3.5" diameter opening. Cross sectional thickness must be measured 1" min. to 1.5" max. Pulling point must not be more than 1.5" from back edge of the pulling device.

6. Tractors must hitch to a stationary draw bar with a max. 20" height, and a min. of 18" from the center of rear axle to the hitch point, no clevises.

7. If weights, excess fluids or any part of the tractor fall off during pull, that pull will be disqualified. Tarp straps are not allowed anywhere on the tractor.

8. All tractors in this class must have wheelie bars that are able to support the weight of the tractor, engine side shields and preferably a clutch blanket.

9. All engine fans must be shrouded with factory shroud or min. of 1/16" thick steel.

10. All tractors must have a safety kill switch or an air shutoff and a 2.5 lb. dry chemical fire extinguisher accessible to the driver while operating the tractor.

11. OEM stock intake and exhaust manifolds must be used for that series engine (alterations for turbo mounting ONLY are allowed).

12. Max Pump Size – 'P Pump'.

13. No restrictions on turbo/one turbo only allowed.

14. 20.8" tires the largest allowed/cut tires allowed.

15. Front weights may not extend more than 13' from center of rear axle to the front of weights. Rear weights may not extend more than 6" past rear tires, and in no way interfere with hooking device or ability to hook and unhook the tractor from the sled.

16. Exhaust MUST discharge vertically and MUST have 2 5/16" cross bolts in exhaust elbow or pipe.

17. 'Hot Farm' tractors are not permitted to pull in any farm stock or antique classes.

18. Driver must wear a motor sport designed helmet. (Snell 80 or higher).

19. Driver must be a minimum of 18 years of age to pull in this class. All drivers must wear leather shoes and long pants.

20. No more than one person is permitted on the tractor at any time.

21. **Driver must remain seated and have at least one hand on the wheel at all times. Driver may not leave the seat of the tractor while it is running.**

22. Rules may be reviewed and/or altered for the betterment of the class by the tractor pull committee.

6,000 lbs. OPEN TRACTOR (Antique Class) RULES

1. Tractor must be pre-1960.
2. No pressurized fuel systems.
3. If any parts fall off during pull, that pull will be disqualified.
4. The tractor tires must remain in the boundaries of the contest course.
5. There will be a 3,000 RPM limit on all classes. Flagman has the authority to stop and check.
