1. Junior Best 3 Females – 3 animals under 2 years of age, bred by exhibitor and carrying the same prefix and at least 1 to be owned by exhibitor. **1 entry per exhibitor.** Junior Show – must be bred & owned by exhibitor.

2. Best 3 Females – 3 females, any age, bred by exhibitor and carrying the same prefix and at least 1 to be owned by exhibitor. **1 entry per exhibitor.** Junior Show – Must be bred and owned by exhibitor.

3. Produce Of Dam – 2 animals, any age, any sex and the produce of 1 cow. The dam must be named. Animals need not be owned by same exhibitor.

4. Daughter/Dam – 2 animals, 1 cow & her daughter, any age. Animals need not be owned by 1 exhibitor.

5. Junior Get of Sire – 3 animals under 2 years of age. Need not all be from 1 herd. Not more than 1 bull.

6. Senior Get of Sire – 3 animals 2 years or over. Need not all be from 1 herd.

7. Dairy Herd – 4 animals any age, owned by one exhibitor.

8. Best udder – Must be in milk at time of show. **2 entries per exhibitor.**

9. Breeders Herd – 2 animals over 2 years of age. 2 animals under 2 years of age. 1 animal any age, any breed, owned by 1 exhibitor (3 have to be owned).

10. Supreme Champion – 1 Grand Champion from each breed

SECTION 1 – BREEDING SHEEP

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. No sheep showing clinical signs of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease including foot rot, sore mouth & external parasites will be admitted to any show.

2. All show sheep must be individually identified by an ear tag or tattoo and this identification must be listed on the CVI.

3. The flock of origin, including sheep consigned to a show, shall be examined by an accredited veterinarian. The veterinarian must prepare the CVI (AAI-13) and must state on the CVI that he examined the entire flock and found no evidence of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease. The date of exam must also appear on the CVI. All sheep from other states must be accompanied by an interstate CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian indicating examination for health within 30 days.

4. Individual official USDA scrapie animal identification is required. Official scrapie ID includes:

- A scrapie eartag. Contact the USDA to obtain scrapie eartags at 1-866-873-2824, weekdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Your order may take several weeks for processing so order tags early; or

- A scrapie tattoo with individual animal ID (tattoo); or

- An ISO-compliant RFID tag.

5. Dipping not required of sheep entries from officially recognized scabies free areas; all other sheep must be dipped in an officially permitted solution within 10 days of the opening date of the show.

6. Shipping fever complex is recommended that all sheep, except those consigned for immediate slaughter, to be properly immunized before shipment to exhibition.

7. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market sheep are exempt from this vaccination requirement). All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated sheep must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

8. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR)* form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
