## GOAT HEALTH REGULATIONS

1. ALL Goats must have an official eartag or legible breed registration tattoo.
2. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
  - A scrapie eartag. Contact the USDA to obtain scrapie eartags at 1-866-873-2824, weekdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Your order may take several weeks for processing, so order tags early; or
  - An ISO-compliant RFID tag; or
  - A scrapie tattoo. Goats with an official scrapie tattoo must also have a unique individual animal ID (tattoo) to meet the scrapie ID requirement; or
  - Goats having a breed registration tattoo and accompanied by a registration certificate are exempt from the scrapie ID requirement if the tattoo is legible and a registration certificate (copy acceptable) or a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection which lists the tattoo and registry accompanies the animal at all times during transport from the premises of birth.
3. No goat showing clinical signs of contagious or infectious disease including caseous lymphadenitis, sore mouth, active earring worm, foot rot, warts, lice and mange will be admitted to the show.
4. An accredited veterinarian shall sign the statement of health on the AAI-13 report that the animals have been examined within 30 days of issuing the CVI. All entries must appear on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
5. No horns except on Angora, Pygmy and Boer.
6. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR)* form must accompany each animal, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.

1. Please note: Pack Goat qualifications are wether or non-lactating doe only.

**Premiums: First \$10; Second \$8; Third \$6; Fourth \$5**

Cpt. ID Nos.	Class
9798	Beginning Pack Goat – Goats age 2 months to 6 months. Must be able to walk on a lead and respond to simple verbal commands. Will carry an empty pack.
9799	Intermediate Pack Goat – Goats age 6 months to 12 months old. Must be able to walk with or without a lead and respond to verbal commands. Will carry a pack no heavier than 10% of its body weight.
9800	Senior Pack Goat – Goats age 12 months and over. Must complete a course walking free using only verbal commands. Will carry a pack no heavier than 30% to 40% of its body weight.

## HEALTH REGULATIONS

1. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship* (VCPR) form must accompany all PA rabbits, and must be presented upon arrival at the exhibition.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases. Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the grounds.
3. After an animal passes its health examination, then the management will temporarily tag the animal's ear and assign the animal to a cage.
4. Animals do not need permanent tattoos.
5. Any rabbit showing signs of disease or poor health during Fair Week will be placed in a quarantined area & must be removed immediately by exhibitor. These health rules will be strictly enforced.

## GENERAL RULES

1. The management will use diligence to ensure the safety of all rabbits after their arrival and placement, but in no case are they responsible for loss or damage.
